As we continue to reflect on and celebrate the
50th Anniversary of the Parish,
we are printing a paragraph or two from Fr. Fourcade's diary of
the parish. Hope you enjoy reading and reflecting on the past.

May 10, 1977: " I regret not keeping this diary up to date - and should have been more accurate with the years or when events occurred.

The St. Joseph Sisters did not return to staff our school in September of 1974. The reason given - their congregation was shrinking in numbers - no vocations, resigning, aging sisters. It is a common problem affecting so many religious groups. I appreciate their reasoning - but I have a feeling I was too conservative for them, and at times wanted things my way. I hope I was not the cause of their leaving; was not really upset as my expectations of them was never realized. A complete lay faculty was the only answer. Earl Mannina became the principal. He had been a Christian Brother and taught at Rummel. As a layman he was in the public school system in New Iberia. To his credit he built up a fine school spirit, many activities, and had a passion to see Sacred Heart excel and make the news. He was not an intellectual. He did increase the prayer life of the school, and advance our image.

St. Charles Borromeo High School in Destrehan was in need of a principal. Mr. Mannina left us in September of 1976 to fill this position. The pay was much better. But God was concerned, as the rest of us were, to find a loyal and capable replacement. I feel He had been saving Melvin DeJean for the job. Mr. DeJean had been with us ten years as science teacher and coach - respected and loved by faculty and students. September 1976 he was the principal.

December 1977: The school again has a problem - to meet the standards now in force by the State and the Board of Private Schools. A principal must have an M.A. - all teachers a degree - may keep my teachers with 5 years service though not degreed. At present, Mr. DeJean has only a BA - he must return to school.

'Let God so do some of the worrying' has become my philosophy."

C.C.D. (Parish School of Religion) News

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL PARENTS OF 9th AND 10th GRADERS ATTENDING CATHOLIC OR PRIVATE SCHOOL!!

If your son or daughter currently attends a Catholic or private high school then you need to register him/her with the parish so they can begin the preparation process to become eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. The preparation process involves three years: During the first two years (generally 9th and 10th grades) candidates must satisfy certain requirements, which are set forth in the Confirmation Handbook (received during registration); and during the third year (generally 11th grade year) candidates are required, in addition to meeting other requirements, to attend immediate preparation classes and a retreat. If you want your son/daughter to be eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation please take time to register at the parish office. Registration will take place by appointment with the Director of Religious Education.
